Message from Our President Sirkku Konttinen

Dear members,

We started 2021 by celebrating our long-time member and former Board member Roy Helander, whose mind and heart are much younger than his impressive age would suggest. A documentary of Roy's acting career prepared by the Finnish American Heritage Society gave us a glimpse of the many things he is famous for in our Finnish community. We thank him for his contributions and look forward to seeing him at our future meetings.

Our last event for the year was an interview with Paralympic champion and Finland's Athlete of the Year Leo-Pekka Tähti, who connected with us via Zoom from Spain. He was born with paraplegia but that did not break his competitive spirit. He had a very normal childhood in Pori Finland with a loving family and friends, with whom he played games and shared adventures growing up. Leo-Pekka's inspiring life story was a great uplift as we entered the holiday season.

In 2021, we also celebrated Marimekko, the seventy-year-old star of Finnish design. This was our only in-person event of the year and it reminded us how much fun it is to be together gathered in the same room. We are optimistic about the future and the planning of more social events this year has already started.

I would like to give a special shout-out to our long-time membership chair Liisa Chanoff, who will be leaving the Board this month. For many decades, Lissu has been the first one to greet you at our meetings and the one to remind you about paying your dues. She has catered events for hundreds and always brought food to our meetings. Before our membership meetings she always says: "I will be there. How can I help?". She is also a long-time board member of the Scandinavian Library and you can sometimes find her serving coffee and pastries in "Kaffestugan", when the little coffee shop is short of staff. In addition to taking care of her own family and grandchildren, she is also a "Mom" for numerous Sudanese refugees who have made this country their home. We are grateful for her exceptional service to our organization and to our community. Fortunately, she is not going anywhere, and you will still see her at our membership meetings.

This also marks the end of my term as President of Finlandia Foundation-Boston, and I want to thank our hard-working Board and all our members for being part of our organization. It has been an honor to serve and a privilege to meet all of you along with so many inspiring guests.
